


Horsham News Update

Your Horsham BID Levy Payer Annual Meeting

Update on HDC's proposed plans for the town centre

Earlier this year we worked with many of you to engage with Horsham District Council on the proposed plans for The Bishopric / Worthing Road and The Carfax. We provided a report to HDC based on your input. Of great concern was the placement of defined cycle lanes in certain key areas. It appears plans are now being revised with this in mind, so watch this space for further updates.







Horsham News Update



West Street roof access



Businesses and residents on West Street, Horsham have reported repeated incidents of young people accessing and running across rooftops. This anti-social behaviour has caused disruption, safety concerns and possible property damage.

In response, a local resident convened a meeting between the Neighbourhood Police Sergeant, Horsham District Council and Your Horsham. The meeting resulted in a collaborative action plan to address the issue. To date, we have:

- 1. Written a joint letter to the parents of the young people involved, requesting immediate intervention to prevent any further access.
- 2. Within the letter, we indicated that we will pursue a civil injunction against those known individuals if further incidents occur.
- 3.Gathered a list of businesses who wish to receive No Trespassing signs FREE from HDC See below to order yours or <u>click here</u> https://forms.office.com/e/mmngRJtRga
- 4. Contacted businesses likely to be affected with a list of possible actions to try to prevent easy access to the roof area.
- 5. Further action required by those affected includes;
 - a. Gathering of evidence, dates, times, photos and police logs
 - b. Risk assessment of access points to buildings
 - c. Request to implement preventative measures to reduce ease of access.

Horsham Ambassador Update




Our ambassadors are here for the businesses and community as a whole. They get involved in all kinds of things from addressing beggars on the street to reporting broken paving slabs and graffiti. They are the main conduit between you and the Your Horsham Board. We have a briefing every day to share experiences, understand the issues you are having and share your knowledge and ideas.

Here are some of our stats since the beginning of our second year. We work closely with the neighbourhood wardens, police and PCSOs and report matters of concern directly to them. We record our interactions in an electronic database and are working to improve the accuracy of our recordings so that we can provide you with up-to-date, useful data.

Our ambassador initiative only started in August 2024 with Lucas, so we don't have any comparative data just yet.

My Week as a Work Experience Student at Your Horsham

As a first-year A-Level student at Collyer's College in Horsham, currently studying Maths, Business and Economics, I had the chance to spend a week with Your Horsham as part of my college's Work Experience programme. What followed was a week full of new experiences, local connections, and a real insight into how the town is supported by its Business Improvement District (BID).



Monday: The week began with a briefing from Rachel, where I was given the task of promoting Horsham town centre and encouraging more businesses to take on work experience students. I spent the day shadowing Lucas, as we created social media content showcasing what local businesses love about the town and how the BID supports them

Tuesday: Today, we visited <u>The Kitchen Store</u> and met Ellie, another work experience student. We filmed a video promoting the benefits of the scheme. I also met Paul Davies of <u>At Home Estate Agents</u>, who sits on the Your Horsham board. He shared the journey of his business, which aims to make buying a house a positive and personal experience. Paul also talked about his latest venture, <u>D'Arcy's Wine Bar</u>. Later, we filmed more content with <u>Johansson's Café</u> and continued promoting local businesses online.

Midweek brought a deeper dive into the challenges local businesses face. We helped resolve an issue with the bins outside <u>Waterstones</u> and collaborated with the <u>Piries Place</u> marketing team to film a video encouraging other businesses to host work experience students. We also created content for <u>Major Mind Games</u>, <u>The Gym Group</u>, <u>Deja</u> Style and Sienna Rocks.

Thursday: I spent Thursday working with Tim, checking in with local businesses to see how they were doing. I also met Willie Hamilton who shared the story of how the BID came about and reflected on his extensive career, particularly at Wakefields Jewellers and other businesses he's been involved in. We rounded off the day with visits to Muffin Break and Green People.

Friday: My final day involved working with Geoff and Lucas on health and safety checks among market stalls and ensuring everything was ready for trading. We popped in to see the team at **Brock Taylor Estate Agents** for a promotional social media post, then finished the day by walking the town centre, chatting with members of the public and continuing the work of making Horsham feel connected and welcoming.

Looking Back: Before this week, I knew very little about what Your Horsham did. Now, I understand how vital the BID is to the heartbeat of the town, from running festive events like late-night Christmas shopping, to organising Al training courses and business support sessions. The Town Ambassadors, who make the BID so visible, do an amazing job of engaging with businesses and the public to support the local community.

This experience has been eye-opening and incredibly valuable. I've enjoyed every moment, and I hope to stay involved with Your Horsham in future projects and events.
